Post nickel-era Ford Model T's, all Model A's, almost anything from the 1930's, and even junior series Packards were considered virtually un-collectible. Spending a lot of my youth at Greenfield Village, I thought of Model T cars and trucks more as tools than antiques. Four years later we moved up to the luxurious leather and walnut of a Humber Super Snipe. For us, these weren't so much antiques as economical and stylish transportation.

Today when I see an “antique”, it's not as much the vehicle I appreciate, but the memories it brings to mind. Like watching our neighbor wash and wax his aqua blue metallic 1963 Oldsmobile 98 every Saturday afternoon, or driving to Greektown with my best friend Dave Samples in his first-generation Mustang, chasing the Gremlin of flying & snow skiing buddy Jay Seyfried, or riding along with my mother in her 1967 Pontiac Executive while singing along to *The Sound of Music* as it played on the 8-track stereo.

But it's not just the old memories. Debra and I still enjoy creating new “antique” car memories during every AACA meeting, tour, and swap meet. Join together with us as we create new memories at the upcoming Pate Swap Meet in April, and the Texas Tour in May.

Paul Alexander — 1946-2024

Paul Alexander was declared the longest surviving iron lung patient last March by the [Guinness World Records](#). He contracted polio during an epidemic of the debilitating disease in the 1950s as a child living in Texas. Despite his condition, Alexander graduated from college with a law degree and ran his own legal practice. He also became a published author with the book "Three Minutes for a Dog," detailing his life.

WHY IS THIS IMPORTANT ? —READ BELOW

A Different Story Than Usual - By Brady Richard

About eight years ago I helped a person in the warehouses behind my car building by machining a couple of acme thread lead screws. When I delivered them I found out they were part of an iron lung and that there was a person living in one in Dallas. I had no idea anyone was still alive that had polio. A short while later the person I did the work for went missing and his warehouse space was being cleared out. I had two of my employees go over and get the iron lungs as I knew they belonged to someone.

A couple of months later a Dallas paramedic came into our main office asking if anyone around here had any iron lungs. Much to their surprise we said yes. That's when I found out about Paul Alexander, the polio survivor. I promptly rebuilt one of the machines and tested it. I got a call about a month later that Paul was in the hospital and this might be a good time to change his machine to the new one. We delivered the rebuilt machine and picked up the old one. Two days later I get a call from his caregiver in a panic about the machine not working correctly. She was unable to tell me what was wrong but it just was not right. Myself and one of my employees grabbed some tools and a few parts and when to his house. We found that the neck collar had not been put on correctly and had popped off the seal. The caregiver had stuffed towels around his neck to make it seal better. What we saw was the top of a head buried in towels.

We knew we would have to stop the machine and remove the neck collar over his head to put it back together. As this was totally new to us we were very concerned and wanted to work fast. Paul assured us he could breathe on his own for around five minutes. We started to work. Paul sounded like a fish out of water, gasping for air. After a couple of minutes I noticed he was getting tired and starting to turn blue. We really got worried as this repair was going to take longer. The caregiver finally calmed down and found his portable machine. We wished we had known about that earlier. Got him on the portable and finished the repairs. That was a very different way to meet someone for the first time.

Over the next few years I had the honor of getting to know Paul and maintaining his machine. The last time I saw him was about a week before he passed away in the hospital complaining about their machine was not working correctly. They called me to see if I could make sure it was. The machine was fine but he was not.

Being around people who have overcome a lot of adversity but can still manage to be happy should be an inspiration for all of us.

It highlights how large our state is, as well as how well the training school could use our local skies to practice long run missions in Europe. Some folks took the shuttle to the hanger in back to see aircraft and larger artifacts. If you didn't make the Tour, it's really worth a trip just to see this well preserved example of history! 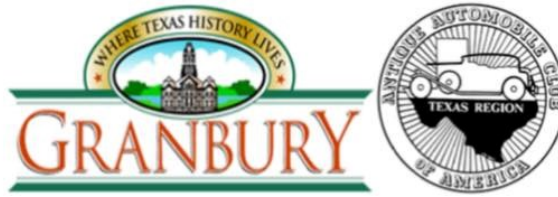
