New Spotlight Delivery Method

Texas DFW Region is now using Mail Chimp to let you know when the Spotlight is available for download from our website, https://texas-dfw.aaca.com/2024-spotlight-newsletters/.

Why Change?

Email providers are cracking down on spam and blocking email addresses that send bulk emails with attachments. Therefore, we are using "Mail Chimp" an email and marketing automation platform to ensure we reach our members and target audience.

What is the New Process:

Once the editors have published the monthly Spotlight to a PDF format, it is emailed to our Webmaster, Chris, and our Mail Chimp Guru, Betty. Once Chris uploads the pdf newsletter to the website, he emails Betty with the link. Betty creates an email using the front cover as the body of the email to send out a notification with a link to the website https://texas-dfw.aaca.com/2024-spotlight-newsletters/. When the recipient opens the email and clicks on the link, it will download to your computer or phone automatically.

The History of one 1968 Ford Ranchero

I purchased my 1968 Ranchero in August of 1974 while working summers for my cousin in Tulsa, Oklahoma. My cousin owned a used car lot and the Ranchero was making the rounds of the wholesale dealer market at the time. At that time the Ranchero was a base model with a 3-speed column shift manual transmission, non-power four wheel drum brakes, a radio and dealer under dash add-on air conditioning. Upon purchase from my cousin I added the GT Wheels and center caps, chrome fender well trim, air shocks and the '72 Torino High Top bench seats. The Ranchero was driven for many years in this configuration.

During the time of my ownership it was the car Linda and I used on our first date while in college (all others as well). It was the car we drove away from the church when we were married on May 15th, 1976.

The Ranchero has served as my work commuter vehicle when I worked for Rockwell International and Nortel. It was also used as



my exclusive work truck while owning and operating my own Skylight Sales and Installation business for 20 years. I did retire it from daily activities in 2012 when a Ford F-150 took over most of its duties. I am now retired and it is again back in service as my daily driver truck.

Twenty plus years ago I purchased a derelict 1968 four door sedan that had Factory A/C, Power Steering and a C4 Automatic Transmission. All of those parts were removed and are currently part of the Ranchero. The original four wheel drum brakes have been replaced with power front wheel disk brakes from a donor 1969 Fairlane at Browne's Auto Salvage in Sunset, Texas. I also have a bench seat waiting to be recovered and installed from the same donor car.

Installing factory A/C in the Ranchero required removing the complete dash assembly from both the donor sedan and the Ranchero and then re-installing the complete donor's dash into the Ranchero. After the dash was bolted in, all wiring starting at the fuse box and all the vacuum hoses had to be hooked up like it was when it came from the factory. It certainly helps to have a factory Wiring and Vacuum Diagram Manual to get everything back in order. Linda and I really enjoyed the factory air conditioning on this latest driving tour to Schulenburg from Dallas. I think all the work was definitely worth the effort.

Over the years many of the parts have been changed as needed to keep the Ranchero on the road in good working condition. I don't know how many times the water pump, fuel pump, brakes and various suspension parts have been replaced. I do know, one cannot drive a late 1960's car 200 thousand miles and not do much more than change the oil and tires as can be done in some of the new cars. A couple of years ago the original 302-V8 needed to be overhauled for the 2nd time. Instead of overhauling it, I decided to replace it with a 351 Cleveland engine. This is the current power source in the Ranchero.

The body was repainted 35 years ago with Sikkens Single Stage Urethane paint. The Ranchero has set outside for all these years and the paint, though showing its age, is still presentable.

Other than the 351C engine, the Ranchero is configured with options that would have been available from the factory in 1968. The only real upgrade that would have been available that is not in the car now is power windows and I'm glad it has manual windows instead. They always work.

As with any old car it is a work in process. Just when you think everything is working as it should it will provide you with the opportunity to have more one-on-one quality time together.
