Approaching from the South:

From LBJ/635, take the Marsh Lane exit heading **north**. Proceed north on Marsh Lane until you cross Belt Line Road. Country Place Drive crosses Marsh Lane, several blocks north of Belt Line Road. There is a signal light at Belt Line, a light at Arapaho Rd, and at Country Place Drive just after crossing a set of railroad tracks. Turn Left on Country Place Drive and the third right side opportunity to turn is the entry to the office/ clubhouse/pro shop area. Bear to the left for parking, and additional parking is at the pro shop. Look for **AACA** signs at the entry and towards the clubhouse.

Approaching from the North:

From George Bush Tollway, take the Marsh Lane exit heading south. Proceed south several miles until you cross Keller Springs Road, which has a signal light.

There will be a light at Carriage Lane, then a light at Country Place Drive. Turn right on Country Place Drive and the third opportunity to turn right is the entry to the office/clubhouse/pro shop area. Bear to the left for parking, and additional parking is at the pro shop. Look for **AACA** signs at the entry and towards the clubhouse.

Member Spotlight—Carey and Sue Frisby



Jerry Smith and John Richardson, new 2023 Co-Editors of the Spotlight, have embarked on a "get to know you <u>better"</u> request to the members. Alas, Sue and I have been selected to be the "trial balloon"! So here goes....

During our working and child raising years, I did not have much time to restore or even own an older car. Many years later, both Sue and I had retired and had moved back to the Dallas area. I heard about an auction of a man's car collection over near Longview. I went with no intention of buying anything, just sounded interesting. The cars were really a bunch of junk, the only interesting car was a 1931 Chrysler CD8 that looked mighty rough, but I fell in love and outbid the guy who was going to use it to make a hot rod. The original car is shown below. Sue wanted to know how much they paid me to haul it away!

Seven years later I finally finished the car and we took it on our first Bill Denman tour down to Central Texas. I must say it was a scary trip, wondering if it would made tall the way. It didn't, lost the water pump bearing, ran out of gas, but made it home.

Early on. we had visited the local Chrysler Club which was focused on muscle cars and they really were not a "happening" club. We then visited Texas Region AACA and were warmly welcomed and even though we did not have a finished car to drive, it made no difference. Bill Denman, Chuck Murphy, and Gordon Hofstra were instant helpers over the years and made lot's of problems an easier fix.

My next project was a 1931 Chrysler Coupe with Rumble seat. Paint job, new tires and a few minor repairs and away we went on our first Texas Tour down in Central Texas.

Unfortunately, as the years have passed by, we found ourselves wanting a better touring car. Our next purchase was a really impressive 1964 Ford Thunderbird. It was supposedly restored, but I never quit working on it. The sensors and convertible top mechanisms were a nightmare!







A car enthusiast friend of mine thought a complete restoration of the T-Bird would be a fun project and mike him some money. I readily swapped the car for his 1975 Buick Delta Royal Convertible with only 8000 miles on the odometer. We drove the Buick for many years to meetings and led tours. It was a great car and so dependable. Our member, Chip Neel, should agree as he now owns the Buick.



The following pic is the Edsel Hardtop that I bought thru EBAY (never again). The Edsel was a restored car needing restoration. The body was OK, new paint job and the upholstery was great, but so many little problems.



I eventually replaced all the lower end components and John Velde came over and helped me install disk brakes. It was a fun car, everyone wondered what it was, Edsel being only a three year production car.

So, here we were, club enthusiasts and no car to drive. So, Sue and I grabbed a plane ride to Pennsylvania and spent three days walking the Hershey car corral, searching for a replacement car. I didn't want a car I had to work on because we had sold our farm where I had the shop and living in a retirement community, garage space was limited.

WE found the 1988 Pontiac Firebird with only 3400 actual miles and bought it on the site. I had it shipped back and after a good cleaning we have enjoyed driving it on tours and going to meetings.

Members since the late 1990's, we have enjoyed the friendship with other members, loved the tours, and always looked forward to the club's activities. Sue held the membership position for several years and I have been Tour Director, Board member, Spotlight Editor, and President during our time in the club. I cannot remember why or how I became editor, I just loved the job, enjoyed taking picturesand highlighting the tours and meetings. I always tried to include member's cars in the publication because— "Who doesn't want to see a picture of their car?" I cannot imagine how some members are going to writeabout their cars because they have so many and have restored so many over the years. But sure would be nice to see and hear about their restorations!!
