It's always fun to see our members show in their favorite (or working at the time) cars. And this time, along with Brady's cars, offered quite the sight.

The AACA Texas Region Fall Tour will be a leisurely drive from North Texas to Hugo, Oklahoma via back roads departing from Buc-ee's on US 75, Exit 45, north of McKinney, Texas. Be ready to leave promptly at 9:30 AM. The plan is to have two stops, the first at Bonham, at an Exxon station, about one hour after leaving Buc-ee's. The next stop will be about 75 miles to Boswell, Oklahoma at a nice Choctaw station. From there it is a short drive to Hugo and lunch at Angie's Circus City Diner. Total miles to Hugo from Buc-ee's is about 120 miles.

After lunch we will drive a short distance back through town to the Frisco Depot Museum which is a fascinating array of period items on the history of Hugo and the influence of the circus business and the rail-road. Your tour package will include some information on the "Harvey Girls" which will also be well represented in the museum collection.

From the museum we will drive to Paris, Tx and the Holiday Inn for our overnight. At the Inn we will have Happy Hour at 5-6 PM, depending on our arrival time and check in. Later, we will order in pizza and salads for a "stay in" dinner in the hospitality room. Water will be provided, so BYOB, be it soft or hard!

Note: Hotel Reservations need to be made by September 7 to get the good rate of \$98 (\$113.68 with tax).

Rate goes to \$129++ after that. Reservations **MUST** be cancelled by OCT 4 (72 hrs) or room will be charged to your credit card.

Minutes of the Texas Region AACA September General Meeting

PLACE: Brady and Vicki Richard DATE: Sunday, Sep 17, 2023 TIME: 2:00 p.m.

Cole Clayton, president, called the meeting to order.

He announced that the treasurer, Kaiden Lenners, could not be at the meeting due to COVID but sent word that the treasury was in good stance. A more specific report will be available next month after the Bugtussle bills are finalized and the Pate check is deposited.

Cole thanked all the people who volunteered for Bugtussle and helped to make it a success.

Kathy Clayton, membership chairperson, announced that there are now 102 members.

Guests included Jack Melton, Kevin Shannon, and Chris and Lee Tousend.

Renewed members Fred and Linda Cruz were also introduced.

The Fall Tour is coming up. John and Denise Velde are the directors of this tour. It will be Oct. 7 and 8. It will travel to Hugo, Oklahoma with a pizza party at the hotel on Saturday night. Thus far, only 10 cars have signed up.

More participation is encouraged.

Denise Velde announced that sheets with member's participation points reported were available at the meeting. The number of points will be made final after the Christmas meeting/party. The number of participation rewards will be determined after the number of points is determined.

Cole suggested that the club name be enhanced by adding "DFW" somewhere in the name. This would save confusion with other AACA clubs in Texas. Originally our club was the first AACA chapter in Texas but now that there are others our club name needs more definition. A significant name change would have to be amended in the by-laws. Kip Lankenau suggested that by placing "DFW" at the end of the current name would not require an amendment to the by-laws.

The proposed enhanced names were "Texas DFW AACA Region" or DFW AACA Texas Region". It was stated that if we change the name that the change would immediately be sent to the national AACA regional representative who in turn will present it for approval at the October national AACA board meeting.

There was a vote taken and the name "Texas DFW AACA Region" won the majority of the votes. However, John Richardson made the observation that it would be necessary to have a quorum present at the meeting to vote on a name change. There were only 41 members present out of 102 members. This was not a quorum. The by-laws state that all should have an opportunity to vote. It was agreed that a letter/email will be sent out with a survey and opportunity to vote. Charlie Gambulos, II was congratulated on being elected to the position of vice-president of the Pate board.

Charlie gave an update on Pate. The club's portion of Pate this year was just received. It is for \$8,500.90. It is about \$1,000 more than anticipated. There are plenty of vendors for Pate but the need is for more foot traffic. Currently the daily attendance is approximately 130,000 people. It was agreed that advertisement was the key to increased attendance. A "bail out clause" was included with the contract with Good Guys.

Cole noted that the use of the extra \$1,000 from Pate will be further determined as soon as the budget is updated with the payment of Bugtussle bills.

Cole said that he needed volunteers for the nominating committee. Please contact him if you are interested.

The facilitation of the Texas Tour will be discussed in depth at the October meeting.

Cole suggested that the Bugtussle date be changed into the fall due to the extreme heat in August. Considering and not overlapping with other important events which include Hershey and the Coastal Cruise, the weekend of September 28 was suggested. John Richardson inquired as to whether or not that would replace the Fall Tour. The answer was that it would not. Nicole Gambulos suggested the weekend of September 7.

She said that she could not take on the organization of Bugtussle after September 7 due to a weekend teaching commitment. She also noted that lodging in Paris might be difficult in the fall due to their commitment to other events .

Chuck Murphy stated that he did not see a need to change the date due to the heat. It has been done before and can continue.

Nicole made the motion to have the Bugtussle the weekend of Sept. 7, 2024. <u>John Richardson</u> seconded the motion. The vote for Sept. 7 was 10 and against it was 10.

Kip Lankenau made the motion to change the Bugtussle date to September 28, 2024. Kim Keith seconded the motion. The vote was 19 for the weekend of September 28 and 10 against September 28. It was determined that Bugtussle will be held the weekend of September 28, 2024. This will be tried out and voted on next year as to whether or not to continue in that September time frame.

Debra Lankenau, hostess of the Christmas meeting/party, passed out information regarding the event. It will be Sunday, December 3 at the Brookhaven Country Club in Dallas from 12:30 until 3:00 p.m.

Cole thanked Brady and Vicki for hosting the meeting.

The next meeting will be at John and Lynda Richardson's home at Lake Kiowa. John encouraged people to bring their fishing poles.

Door prizes were drawn and the winners were the Doug and Susie Simone, Jeff Podmers, and Fred and Linda Cruz.

### The PATE Report

On September 16, 2023, twelve of the thirteen clubs that make up the Pate Swapmeet entity, sent representatives to meet in Waco, TX. The primary purpose of this quarterly meeting was to discuss "Pate" business and for each club to receive its share of the proceeds from the 2023 Pate Swapmeet. I attended for Cole Clayton as President, and Charlie Gambulos rep'd the club as well as his ongoing role in Pate.

There were **1330** club members represented. The way the club proceeds are calculated is: **Revenue – expenses =** to be shared **proceeds/1330**. So, that number this year ended up being about **\$90** per person. Those clubs with the most members received the most money from their Pate efforts. Our club will receive around \$8,500 for work done in 2023. This is considerably above the payouts received over the last few years. Our Pate entity has a very capable treasurer, **Ross Douglas**, in place.

Some other notable points:

1. Our own **Nichole Gambulos**, Pate Registrar, reported that as of that date, there had been about 6400+ spaces sold for next year's Swapmeet already, totaling over \$390,000.

2. **Thorne Smith**, the new website administrator, reported that the website has been upgraded and seems to be functioning well. There was much discussion about moving more marketing attention to social media.

3. Our own **Charlie Gambulos and Thorne Smith** were sent to Charlotte, N.C. to observe their Swapmeet. They reported that Charlotte had not handled the "COVID" situation well and were struggling now partly because of that. The trip seemed to be valuable experience for our Pate entity to learn from.


4. There was much discussion about different needs to service Pate customers better as well as impact on expenses. Everyone seemed to be very cost conscious.

5. The nominating committee for the officers of 2023-2024 reported and there were elections of several directors. Our own **Charlie Gambulos won the 1st VP position**, in a run off. This is a big deal for our club!! <u>Congratulations to Charlie!!</u>

6. Finally, Russ Gruenwald was there. Russ started in 1976 and had a couple of stories that were entertaining. One of the things he suggested/warned was <u>to keep good records</u> and make sure they exist for the future. Let's not take this sage advice lightly.

Since Pate is our club's only income generator and now Charlie Gambulos is 1st VP, we should expect to hear more insight from Pate at our monthly meetings!


