

October Meeting Minutes

DATE: Sunday, October 15, 2023

TIME: 2:00 p.m.

PLACE: John and Lynda Richardson's home, Lake Kiowa, TX.

The meeting was called to order by **Cole** Clayton, president.

He thanked **Brady and Vickie** Richards for hosting the meeting last month and **John and Lynda** Richardson for hosting the meeting this month.

Guests were introduced which included **Warren Waggoner**, **Nicole Gambulos'** father, **David Grant**, guest of **John and Lynda** Richardson, and **Mitch and Colleen Netterville**, guests of **Chris and Linda** Stathopulo.

Cole gave the treasurer's report for **Kaiden** Lenners, the treasurer. Currently the month started out with \$14,478.00, however there were BugTussle expenses to be met which left the current amount at \$13,974.00. There are also two CD"s which will most likely be moved upon maturation next year due to their current low interest rates.

Kathy Clayton, membership chairperson, reported that the current membership was 103. A guest at last month's meeting joined.

Nuris Hester, sunshine chairperson, had nothing to report.

Chris Stathopulo reported that the webpage with AACA nationals is up but that AT will have to add in all of our activities. **Chris and Nicole** Gambulos will work together on the website. **Nicole** stated that there is already a local website which includes club information along with videos of the Texas Tour, Bug Tussle and other club events.

Cole said that a survey of the members was done through e-mail as to the name change of the club from "AACA Texas Region" to "DFW AACA Texas Region". The returned votes were 64 for the change and 3 against. This change has been forwarded to the national AACA for approval.

It was also reported that BugTussle has a new date of September and that the venue has remained the same. Paris and Farmersville have been notified and have put BugTussle on their event calendars.

Debra Lankenau reminded club members that the Christmas party is going to be on Sunday, December 3. It will be 12:30 until 3:00 p.m. at the Brookhaven Country Club. The cost will be \$25.00 per person. This fee will have to be paid by November 17 in order to be included.

October Meeting Minutes cont'd

The question of an admission fee to get into Pate was presented. There are 12 clubs that participate in Pate to determine this. However, it is being discussed. Something to consider is that if even a \$1.00 were charged that the overall income from the swap meet would increase significantly. Currently the money generated from the \$10.00 parking fee goes only to Texas Motor Speedway. **John** Richardson suggested blending the parking and entrance fee. **Al** Mahanna noted that that would not work with TMS. They would take the entire amount. Cole noted that eventually if an entrance fee was required by TMS then they would keep both the entrance and parking fees. If we began to charge an entrance fee now through our own decision then Pate will keep the entrance fee money and TMS can not claim them. **Jerry** Smith said that many of the economic groups that attend the event may find the additional fee difficult to pay. **Joel** Roper said that it was not unusual to pay an entrance and parking fee at such events.

It was noted that **Good Guys** will charge \$25.00 for admittance as well as \$10.00 parking.

An informal vote was taken as to whether or not to charge an admission fee for Pate. 32 attending members voted in favor and 2 voted against. **Charlie** Gambulos II said that more than 50% of the Pate Board were in favor of an admission fee.

Charlie also said that TMS is very happy with Pate and that a three year contract has been made. With the current arrangement that the Speedway gets 18% of the intake plus all of the parking fees.

Cole said that according to the bylaws that spouses of members could not vote unless they had a separate membership. If the spouse paid a separate fee as a member then they would be allowed to legally vote. This option would be further discussed at the next meeting.

An update on the Texas tour was given. The dates are May 16-19, 2024. It was reminded that seven clubs take turns hosting the event. It is the premier event of the touring season. This May it is our club's turn to host. **Nicole and Charlie** Gambulos, II are the chairpersons. Nicole encouraged everyone to offer to help in some capacity. There are **sign up sheets for many different committees** available. The host hotel will be the Hilton Garden Inn at Granbury. Some of the activities could include visiting a car collection in the area, a visit to Comanche Peak nuclear plant, and use of a race track in the area. Other suggestions are welcomed. A motion to allow \$3200 of club money be used as a deposit to hold the banquet venue was made by **Kip** Lankenau and seconded by **Cole** Clayton. This money will be recovered as people pay their registration for the tour.

Cole said that he would put together a nominating committee for the officers of 2024 during the meal. **Kip** Lankenau offered to be on that committee.

The winners of the door prizes were: **Joel** Roper, **John and Lynda** Richardson, and **Brady and Vicki** Richards.

The meeting was adjourned.
