# January General Meeting of the AACA-Texas Region January 16, 2022 2:00 at Palmer ISD Admin Bldg in Palmer, TX

Nichole Gambulos, president, opened the meeting. She asked if the minutes of the December meeting were approved. John Velde, moved to approve the minutes and Charlie Gambulos, II seconded the motion. The minutes were unanimously approved.

Colin Hiley, retiring treasurer, gave the December financial report.

Nuris Hester, Sunshine Chairperson, gave a report.

- Kathryn Priest has had a set back due to complications from her surgery
- Doug Siminoe has had a biopsy for cancer.
- Sandie Gambulos has just recovered from pneumonia.

Kathy Clayton, membership chairperson, reported that there were no guests at the meeting. There are 5 new members. Their names are Michael and Terry Hrehocik, Hank and Melanie Crosby, Bob and Mary Lou Burr, Colin Connery, and Howard and Kristee Westerman. Last year there were 114 members. Currently 93 members have reregistered. There are five non-renewals. There are still 16 members who have not renewed their membership.

Kathy said that handouts will be available at the next meeting. These are to be used to hand to potential new members when members are at car events. Kathy said that she would like to contact the national headquarters to get a list of local members that they have. Possibly there are some national members that we could recruit to be local members as well.

Roger Dennison reminded the membership that the deadline for submitting articles, etc for "The Spotlight" is the third week of each month. Monthly "The Spotlight" for the coming month will be sent out at the very end of the current month. Someone inquired as to how many copies are mailed out as compared to those that receive it on line. Roger said that he mails out 7 copies; all others are e-mailed.

Larry Kollie stated that for twenty-one years the North Texas Hudson Club has sponsored the Orphans and Sweethearts car event annually. Most recently it has been in Waxahachie. An orphan car is any car that was produced in or prior to 1942 as well as all other makes no longer in production (e.g., Packard, Pontiac, Plymouth, ...). In the past this event has been held in the latter part of February. The agenda was Friday, a tour; Saturday, a car show on the square, along with a banquet and awards. Preparation for this event requires that all the shopkeepers on the square have to sign an approval. Larry was proposing that the antique car club (AACA-TR) assume the responsibility for this event. He also proposed that when starting out that the event could be pared down. Registration was the most challenging part of organizing it. There is an opportunity to make a little money such as a raffle, registration, etc. if the club wants to do that.

Nichole asked if the club was interested in picking up this event. Charlotte Goforth presented a cautionary note that Larry and Pat Kollie spent a great deal of time and energy in organizing this event. They loved the tour but it required a great effort. Nichole then asked the membership if they were interested in organizing a pared down version of this event. Jeff Podmers made the motion for the club to take on this event. John Velde seconded it 19 people voted for it and 6 against the proposal. 10 members abstained. The motion passed. There may be a later date for the event so that plans can be made.

Nichole announced that the Texas Tour had changed their plans to have a tour into Mexico. There will be an alternate tour instead. The Texas Tour will be March 31 through April 3 in Harlingen. There is a block of 35 hotel rooms that will be held until March 1. After that rooms will be difficult to find due to the fact that a large number of national guard troops are being sent to the border and many will be lodged in Harlingen.

Charlie Gambulos II said that there was nothing new to report about Pate. It is anticipated that all 10,000 vendor spaces will be sold out. The check for the 2021 swap meet will be issued in April. There is an organizational meeting to be held in Waco at the end of February. After this next meeting it will be decided whether or not Pate will continue with the same webmasteror will develop a new website.


