

Nichole gave an update on the BugTussle Trek. This year non-members registration for the event will be \$5.00 more. The cost of everything (i.e. tee shirts) will be \$1.00 more. The host hotel, Holiday Inn Express, will be \$95.00 a night and with the rental of 20 or more rooms, the hospitality room will be free to the club. This year's shirts are Cars themed with a caricature of George's truck on them. The theme is "Life is a Highway"!

Pate Swap Meet Update



June 12th General Meeting 1001 Kiowa Drive West, Lake Kiowa

Lake Kiowa is a small, private community southeast of Gainesville TX on FM 902. The address is 1001 Kiowa Drive <u>West</u>, and any map app will get you there quite well. Assuming the weather is appropriate, I'll plan on having my white Ford Skyliner out front to mark the house. There is parking in our long driveway, but likely not enough for everyone. So, assuming they aren't home, we'll use our next door neighbor's driveway (on the right facing the house) for



the moderns. If we fill both, overflow parking will be at the lodge down the street to the right – about an 8 minute walk away.

You are welcome to come as early as 1pm, but the meeting will begin at 2pm as usual.

From DFW and north Texas there are a number of approaches that offer great backroad drives.

If you are coming up I-35, consider getting off on FM 3002/Lone Oak road north of Sanger.

From Dallas, you can go up DNT extension beyond 380 to 428, right to 455 and left/west to 377, or up Preston road to Gunther and west on FM 121 to Tioga.

If up 75, exit FM 121 at Van Alstyne, and west to 377.

Also FM 902 comes west all the way from SH 75 and is a good drive.

If you were planning on coming west on 82, consider FM 56, which is a nice 2 laner that parallels 82.

We plan to cater a meal in, so no need to bring anything unless you have special dietary needs (or let us know in advance). If you would like, you can certainly bring something to share as a treat for dessert. After the meal you are welcome to stay as long as you like and enjoy the lake view. If you are an avid fisherman feel free to bring your own gear to fish off the dock. It's a stocked lake. And if you are interested in the community, feel free to drive around the lake on Kiowa Drive.




