# November Meeting and Thanksgiving Celebration

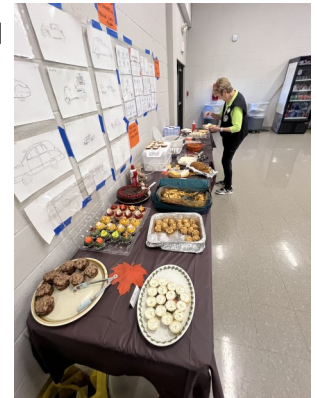

- **1979 Pontiac Trans Am** – Drag-strip beast, second owner (August 2015)
- **1990 Pontiac GTA** – Acquired in 2009 with just 61K miles
- **1993 Pontiac Firehawk** – Bought in 2019 with only 6K miles
- **1997 Mercedes SL500** – Surprise addition in 2013 with 69K miles



#### What sparked my passion for vintage and classic cars?

It all started just before high school. Back then, muscle cars ruled my world. My stepdad bought a brand-new Plymouth Satellite with a 383 Commando engine, 4-speed, and a 3.23 rear end—a torque monster! I drove it through high school and, yes, did plenty of *secret* street racing. Growing up in Bossier City, LA, the Shreveport/Bossier area was alive with street races. We'd cruise between Kokomo Drive-Ins in Shreveport and Bossier, lining up for runs.

Some of my dream rides back then?

- **'69 Z28 Camaro** with a 302
- **'69 Boss 302 Mustang**
- **'66 Dodge Dart** with a 440 3-BBL
- **'69 Hemi Cuda**
- **'70 Mach I** with a 351
- **'70 SS 454 Chevelle** with Cowl Induction

Those nights were pure adrenaline—and the memories still roar today.

# New Member Profile cont'd

## My Current Cars and Their Stories

### 1974 Pontiac Formula

My first new car, purchased in July 1974 for \$5,200—when my Air Force salary was just \$4,700 a year! Ascot Silver paint, dual snorkel hood (still the best-looking hood ever, in my opinion). Originally a Formula 350 2bbl, it wasn't a powerhouse, but it was my family car and ran strong. Over the years, I upgraded it—today it's a Formula 455 with fuel injection and serious performance mods. It's a beast now!

I've taken it on epic cruises like the **Bandit Run**—over 3,000 miles in a week. Originally, it guzzled gas at 6 MPG with a Turbo 350 and 3.73 rear end, so I swapped in a 700R4 in 2014, bumping MPG to around 12.



### 1979 Pontiac Trans Am

Bought in 2015 for drag racing with the Dallas Area Pontiac Club. Though they dropped racing from their event, I joined the TMCCC race program and never looked back. This car is all about Driving Excitement—trailed to the track, runs on 110 octane race fuel. I rebuilt its 455 alongside my Formula's engine. It consistently runs **7.1 sec @ 96 MPH in the eighth mile** and **11.1 sec @ 119 MPH in the quarter**. Not the fastest, but consistent and a Pure thrill.



### 1990 Pontiac GTA

This one was unexpected. My high school best friend told me his brother was selling it for \$2,500—way under market. We even told him to ask for more! I split the cost with my friend, then bought him out later and added extra cash to make it fair. Other than sunburned seat covers that have been replaced by Sue at ASM Upholstery, it is in great shape and has since won multiple show awards.

### 1993 Pontiac Firehawk

Another gem thanks to my high school buddy. I was eyeing a Pontiac GXP when he found a '93 Firehawk in Tampa with only **6,000 miles**. I bought it and drove it home to McKinney in 2019—on its original 1993 tires! Rough ride, but unforgettable. The 6-speed manual and that exhaust note? Absolute joy.

### 1997 Mercedes SL500

This one was a surprise. I spotted it at a Streetside Classics show in Ft. Worth—clean, 69K miles, listed at \$19K. A few weeks later, a friend told me the owner was pulling it from consignment and selling for \$14K. I asked around—no takers. Then I thought, *Myra always wanted a Mercedes*. Perfect way to get her into car shows with me. She loves it! Quick with a 5.0, and according to the docs, the '97 is the fastest of the R129 series. The removable hardtop takes two strong people, but it's worth it. Maintenance? More expensive than my Pontiacs, and parts are tough to find—but it's a classic.

- Use a friendly, welcoming voice—like you’re chatting with fellow enthusiasts.
- Respond kindly to comments or questions.
- Report any inappropriate comments, spam, or negative interactions to an admin.

#### 5. Security & Privacy

- Never log in from public or shared computers.
- Do not download or share private member information.
- If you leave the volunteer team, your access will be removed—no hard feelings, just good housekeeping!
