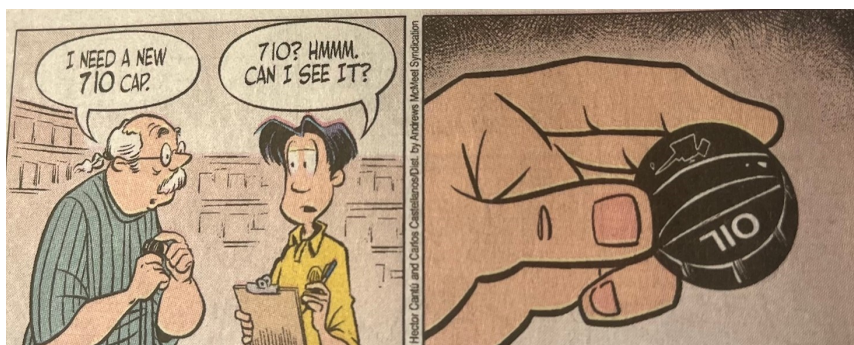

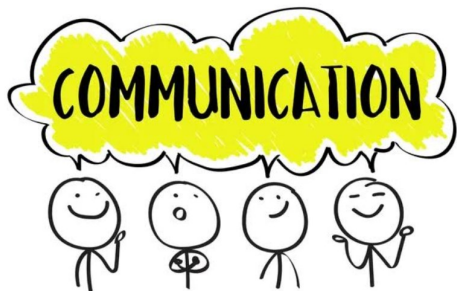

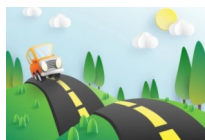

# CUBA !!

In January Vickie and I toured Cuba

American cars built before Cuba's 1959 revolution are an integral part of everyday life in Cuba, with many cars still in use as private cars or taxis. The trade embargo imposed by the United States of America with Cuba in 1960 means that for decades, without any spare parts, Cubans have been restoring and maintaining their vehicles with incredible ingenuity. Havana has the most operational vintage cars on their streets than anywhere in the world.



The United States embargo against Cuba continues today. As a result, Cubans are creative, trading and repurposing vintage car parts to make existing vehicles operational for 50+ years despite their challenges. Cuban ingenuity keeps these old vintage cars running.



In Havana, we met the President of the Cubano Vintage Car Club at his shop. He had a totally original Dodge Kingsman as well as a Plymouth. Both were in great shape, stock motors but each had alternators that were Soviet.

It seems a lot of the cars from Russia in the 60's had similar components as the American counterparts. The mechanics excel in taking whatever component they have and adapting it to their needs. You would see a lot of '55 Chevys that looked stock except for the diesel rattle under the hood. Quite a few of these cars got a transplant from a Ural truck or tractor. We got a ride in a 1932 Ford Model B. When the driver started it, I commented that it did not sound stock. Turns out it had a 1980's LADA 4-cylinder motor in it with less horsepower than the original.

They were probably the first to shave off chrome and medallions off the cars. There is no way to re-chrome or get new hardware, so they just take them off. Same with the large chrome bumpers. Most are just painted silver now. I don't know where they get the upholstery components but the workmanship was excellent and the material was good quality.



If you ever need a great mechanic that can fix anything with very little seek out a Cuban, they are like old farmers with baling wire.

From the political perspective, the country is on the verge of a total collapse. The government is broke and they cannot pay the employees. One of the problems now is trash pickup. The trash men sell the gas out of the trucks on the black market to survive which leaves the trash piled up. The black market is where you buy what you need to survive. During the Soviet era everyone got a ration book that met your monthly nutritional needs. That's no longer available and most of the goods coming into the country are imported with permission from the government by small business. This has increased since 1997 as the government could no longer support the people and are attempting a free market society. The total tax rate on imports is 15 %.



The medical and education system is free to everyone. Cuba has more doctors per capita than any other country. They had their own Covid vaccination before we did and apparently it was very successful. Our local tour guide born with a heart defect and months. She is 11 years old now had to have open heart surgery at the end of last year.



As an indicator of how far the country has declined, the staff remained very professional but there was no anesthesia available. They had to improvise with nerve blocks and local anesthesia to get the procedure completed. They have world class plastic surgeons. If a woman wants breast implants the doctor selects the size required and then gives you ideas as to where to find them on the black market. You procure the implants and then get your date for the surgery.



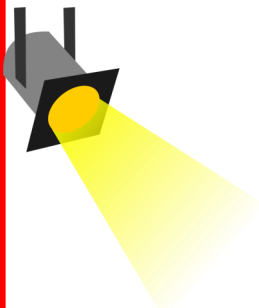
Tourism is all they have besides Rum and Tobacco, which they export. With no other operational export industry, the effect of Covid and the government closing the island for two years the effect was devastating. They have a democratically elected parliament and president, but the army still runs the country. How they dig out of this mess will require a massive government overhaul and lots of foreign investment.

After being in the country and getting to know the Cuban people we hope they get the changes done quickly so they can all look forward to a better future. It's a beautiful island with lots of natural beauty.

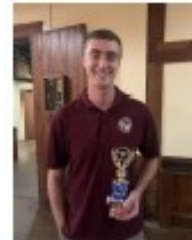

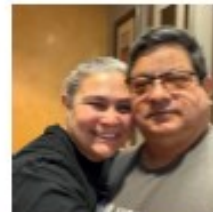
