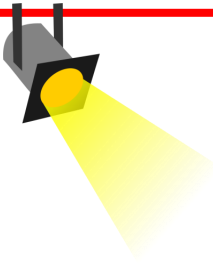
morning. **Thanks, Robby and guys!!**

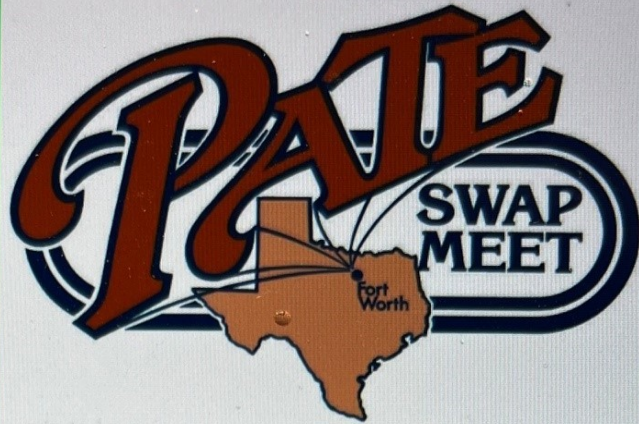

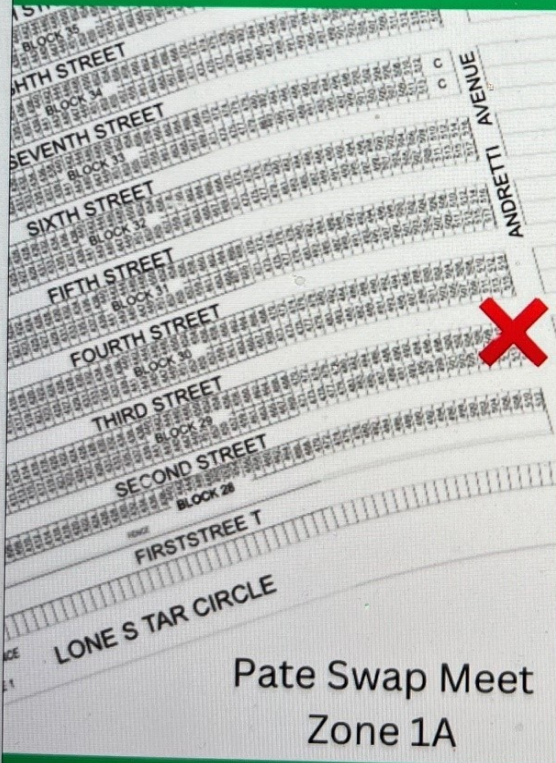
